

Whole Home Water Filtration Systems

Point-of-entry filtration treats water where it enters the house, so the shower, laundry and every faucet get the same protection as the kitchen sink. In Central Florida that mostly means catching chlorine or chloramine, sediment and the sulfur smell that shows up on well systems.

Signs you need this

- Chlorine smell strongest in the shower
- Dry skin or itchy scalp after bathing
- Grit in aerators or a cloudy first pour
- Rotten-egg odor on hot water
- Rubber seals and washers failing early

How it works

1. Main-line assessment

We check flow rate, pressure and plumbing layout so the filter never becomes a bottleneck for the house.

2. Media matched to your water

Catalytic carbon for chloramine, standard carbon for chlorine, and specialty media when the test shows iron or sulfur.

3. Self-backwashing operation

The system rinses its own bed on a schedule, so there is no cartridge to change every few months.

What you get

- Clean water at every tap, shower and appliance
- No chlorine vapor in the shower
- Protects softeners and RO membranes downstream
- Little to no routine cartridge cost

Frequently asked questions

Do I need a softener too?

Filtration removes taste, odor and particles; it does not remove hardness. In Central Florida most homes benefit from both, and they install together on the same main line.

Will it drop my water pressure?

Not when it is sized correctly. We measure your service line and peak demand before quoting a tank size.
